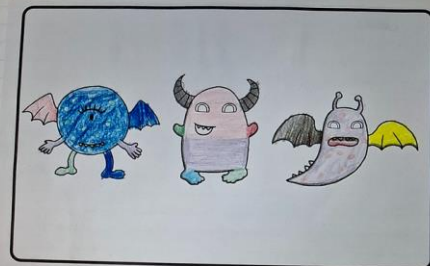
## Hedgehog

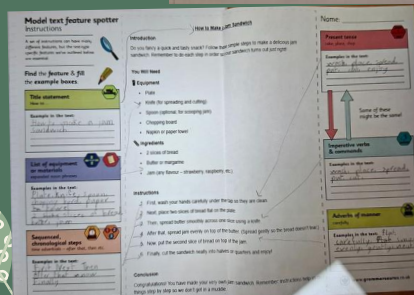
## Squirrel

We have loved starting our new writing unit all about instructions! First, we explored lots of examples and discovered what makes instructions clear and easy to follow. Then we practised giving and following instructions ourselves, sometimes it was easy, and sometimes it was a little confusing! This helped us realise what really matters: using clear steps, following chronological order, and adding helpful details so everyone knows exactly what to do. Soon, we'll be writing our own sets of instructions, so watch this space for some amazing instruction writing coming soon.



### Instructions

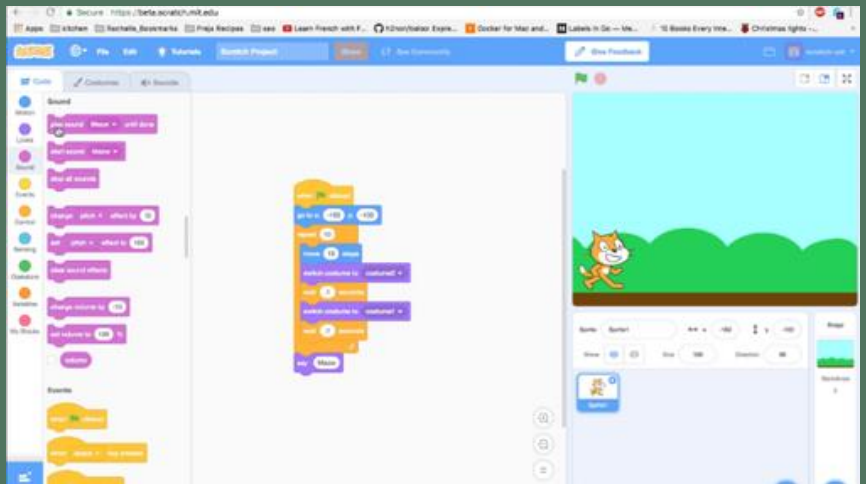
1. Colour one of the first monster's wings red.
2. Colour one of the middle monster's arms green.
3. Colour the first monster's legs blue and green.
4. Colour the last monster's wings yellow and black.
5. Colour the middle monster's feet blue and green.
6. Colour the first monster's other wing blue.
7. Colour the middle monster's body pink and purple.
8. Put pink spots on the last monster's body.
9. Put green spots on the first monster's face.
10. Finish colouring in the monsters with any colours you choose!

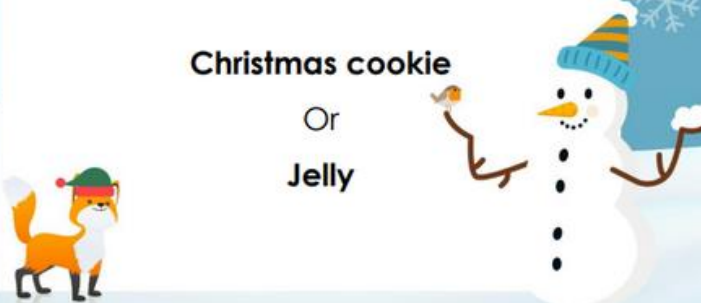

## CORNWALL FA HQ FACILITY UPDATE

Cornwall FA are delighted to share that progress continues to be made on our plans for a new Headquarters in Bodmin, working in close partnership with Bodmin Town Council, Bodmin Town Football Club, the Football Foundation, and other key stakeholders. The project's ambition is to deliver a stadium-standard 3G pitch suitable for the National League System and Women's Tier football, alongside a modern community building with changing facilities and additional spaces designed to support grassroots football and wider community use.

Both the stadia 3G pitch and community building will be developed at the same time including community engagement. With the likelihood of the stadia 3G pitch being able to come forward quicker than the community building.

# Attendance Message



If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £80 if paid within 21 days or £160 if paid after this but within 28 days.

If your child is further absent from school without authorisation within any 3-year period, you will be committing a further offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices for a second offence are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £160, payable within 28 days. Importantly, fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three-year period. Once this limit has been reached, other action such as a parenting order or prosecution will be considered.

Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may also result in legal action. If you are prosecuted and attend court because your child has not been attending school, you could get a fine of up to £2,500. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs. Absence not authorised by the school may also result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Again, Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs. Money raised from fines is only used by the local authority to cover the costs of administering the system, and to fund attendance support. Any extra money is returned to the government.
