- Give at least two examples of ways in which Christians follow the teachings studied about forgiveness and peace, and bringing good news

Year B: Spring 1.8 - Why makes some places sacred to believers?

- Give examples of stories, objects, symbols and actions used in churches, mosques and/or synagogues which show what people believe
- Give simple examples of how people worship at a church, mosque or synagogue
- Talk about why some people like to belong to a sacred building or a community

Year B: Spring 1.9 How should we care for others and the world and why does it matter? Give an example of how people show that

- they care for others (e.g. by giving to charity), making a link to one of the stories
- Give examples of how Christians and Jews can show care for the natural earth
- Say why Christians and Jews might look after the natural world

Year A: Spring 1.3 - Why does Christmas matter to **Christians**

Give examples of ways in which Christians use the story of the Nativity to guide their beliefs and actions at Christmas
