We look forward to welcoming you all back, refreshed and ready for a fantastic summer term.



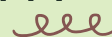
Summer Term Football Club

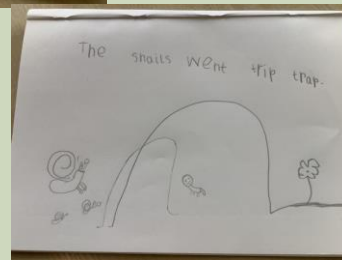
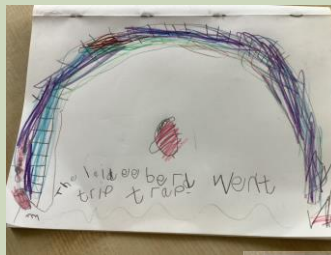
Class Update

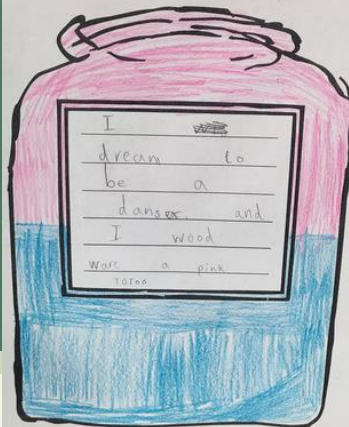
My character description:

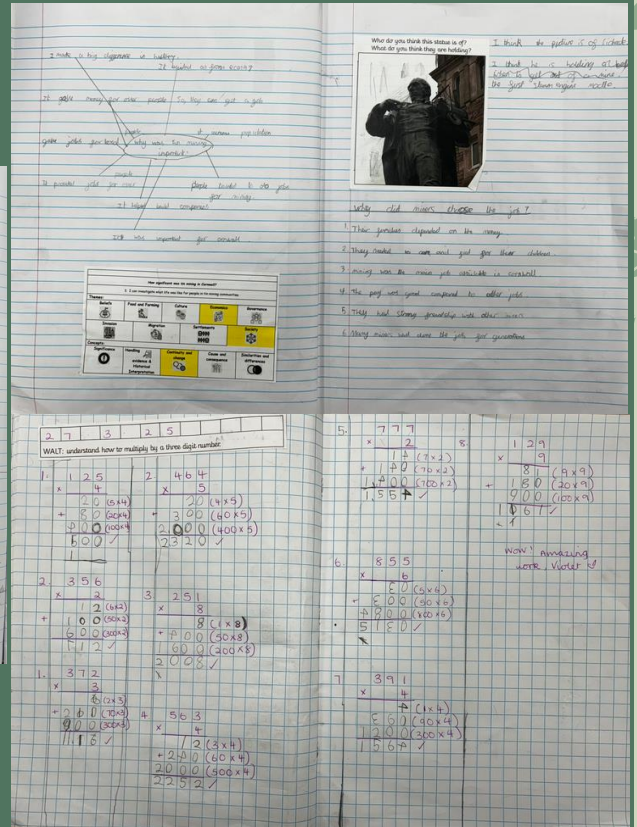

River Field Trip



Deer class are little superstars! On Thursday 20th March Deer class did a 4 mile walk in and around Cardinham Woods to conduct a local river study of Cardinham Waters for our geography topic.

We completed annotated sketches of the river, identifying different features such as meanders, waterfalls, tributaries and confluences. Great discussions were had about oxbow lakes and where they might form along this river and why. We also took some data samples from the river. We measured the depth, width and river speed. To measure the river speed, we dropped oranges and dog biscuits in the river and timed them over a 10 metre stretch.

All of the pupils were exceptionally well-behaved and represented the school brilliantly. We were even commented to by some members of the public on how polite and considerate the children were. I am very proud of all of you. Well done! Miss Horsington.

Attendance Message



If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £80 if paid within 21 days or £160 if paid after this but within 28 days.

If your child is further absent from school without authorisation within any 3-year period, you will be committing a further offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices for a second offence are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £160, payable within 28 days. Importantly, fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three-year period. Once this limit has been reached, other action such as a parenting order or prosecution will be considered.

Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may also result in legal action. If you are prosecuted and attend court because your child has not been attending school, you could get a fine of up to £2,500. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs. Absence not authorised by the school may also result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Again, Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs. Money raised from fines is only used by the local authority to cover the costs of administering the system, and to fund attendance support. Any extra money is returned to the government.
