Key Indicators - The Department for Education vision is that all pupils leaving primary school are physically literate and have the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport. - 4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- 5. increased participation in competitive sport
